












BSL GCSE Consultation

From the DfE "We have worked with experts and stakeholders to develop corricular subject content for a new GCSE in BSL. The focus of the GCSE is language study and pupils will be required to:

- ★ comprehend BSL
- ★ produce signs accurately
- ★ interact using BSL
- ★ develop an understanding of the history of BSL

Findings from this consultation will be taken into account when finalising the subject content."
